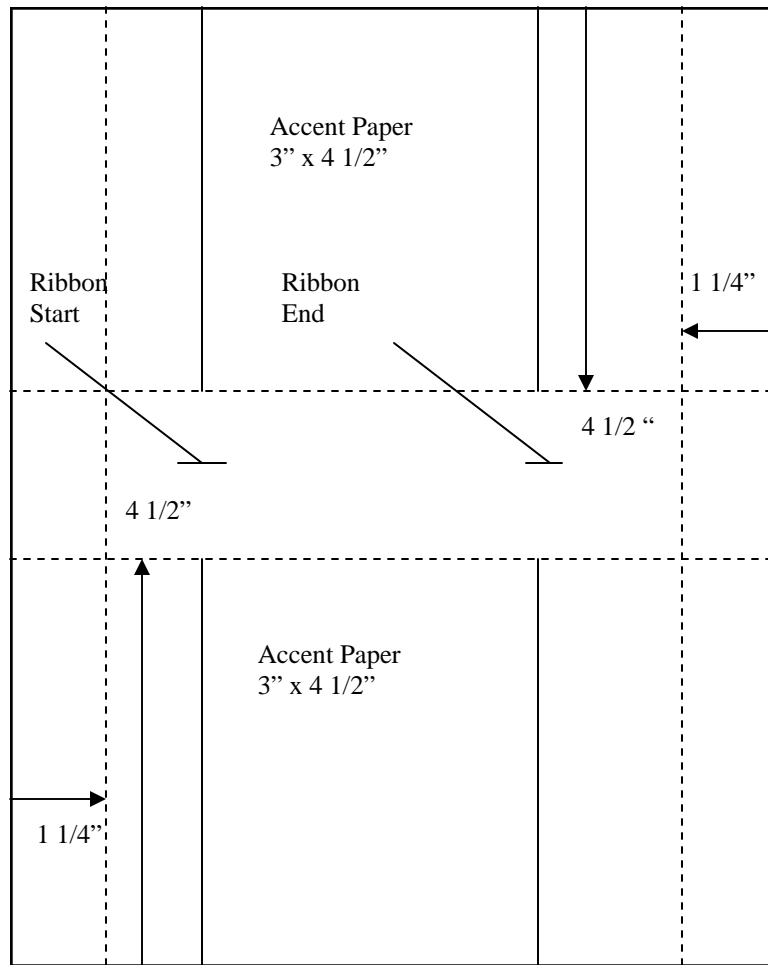


Paper Tote Bag:



Cut two pieces of ribbon to 18" for tote bag handles!





Instructions for cards:

1. Find a piece of B&T paper and cut it to the size of 4 1/4" x 5 1/2". Cut 4 pieces. This is the background for four of the cards. (The sample above shows a stripe B&T paper).
2. If you notice the white card above, I random stamped the background of that card with 2 of the stamps From my Solo Stamp Set!
3. Because everyone is using a different Solo, everyone will have a different size of white cardstock. The best way to determine the size to cut your paper is to take your large letter and measure. Add 1/2 inch to the to the size going both vertically and horizontally.
4. Take the Coco cardstock and cut it 1/2 larger then your white sheet both vertically and horizontally.
5. Use your ribbon, extra cardstock and accents to decorate your cards.
6. Have fun, and be original. All cards will be different!



Coaster Frame Instructions:

Step 1:

Measure and mark with a pencil placement for hinges on your coasters. You will use 2 hinges per coaster. Using a foam piece underneath your coaster, punch a hole with a large push pin all the way through your coasters where marked.

Step 2:

Using a coaster as your template...trace around it on the back of all pieces you are going to use as your base pieces...4 if using 2 square coasters. Using a strong, permanent glue....glue down your front base pieces. ONLY the front half of your frame base papers are glued down at this time.

Step 3:

Hinge together all of your drink coasters using brads. Remember...2 hinges to connect coasters 1 and 2.

Step 4:

After all hinges are in place...turn your frame over and glue your last base pieces onto your frame back...covering the brads.

Step 5:

Choose your paper pieces to use as photo mats. Measure the inside space on your coasters and cut your mats to that size. Remember to add any embellishments that you want tucked under the paper, or brads, before gluing pieces down. Glue your mats in place. Now is the time to add photos if you have them handy.

Step 6:

Your frame is almost finished! Now is the time to add all of those extra embellishments. You're DONE!
